#### Scooter and bike safety

Many of our Year 3-6 students are riding their scooters and bikes to and from school and are also out and about after school. While these activities are a fantastic way for our children to stay active and enjoy the outdoors, it's crucial that we prioritise safety. One of the most important safety measures is ensuring that our children wear helmets at all times while riding.

#### Why Helmets Matter

Helmets are designed to protect our children's heads from serious injuries in case of falls or accidents. Studies have shown that wearing a helmet can reduce the risk of head injury by up to 85%. This simple piece of safety equipment can make a significant difference in ensuring our children remain safe while enjoying their rides.

#### Choosing the Right Helmet

When selecting a helmet for your child, consider the following tips:

- Fit is Key: A helmet should fit snugly on your child's head without being too tight. It should sit level on their head and not tilt forward or backward.
- Check for Certification: Look for helmets that meet safety standards, such as those certified by the Australian and New Zealand standards (AS/NZS 2063).
- Comfort and Style: Encourage your child to choose a helmet that they find comfortable and appealing. This can help ensure they are more likely to wear it consistently.

#### Setting a Good Example

Children often model their behaviour after adults. By wearing helmets yourself when riding bikes or scooters, you set a positive example for your children. Share the importance of safety and discuss the potential consequences of riding without proper protection.

#### Encouraging Safe Riding Habits

In addition to wearing helmets, it's essential to teach children about safe riding practices:

- Always look both ways before crossing the street.
- Use hand signals to indicate turns and stops.
- Stay within designated bike lanes or paths when available.
